This Indenture made the day of in the year 1681 between John Harris and Mary his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Jacob Mirell of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Harris and Mary his wife in consideration of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Jacob Mirell at or before the making and delivery of these presents have bargained and sold unto the said Jacob Mirell his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and bounded as following beginning at a place corner between John Harris and Jacob Mirell there to a commoner tree corner between John Harris and James McElroy there to a place corner between Jacob Mirell and James McElroy thence to the beginning containing acres to be the sum more or less together with every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said land with the parts and parcels before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their right members and appurtenances unto the said Jacob Mirell his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Harris and Mary his wife for themselves and their heirs the said land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Jacob Mirell his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of them the said John Harris and Mary his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all other every person or persons what ever shall well and we warrant and forever defend by these presents. This Indenture made this 16<sup>th</sup> day of August AD 1681 between William Johnson of the first part Jacob H. Duck of the second part and Mills & Lawrence of the third part. whereas the said William Johnson is justly indebted to the said Mills & Lawrence in the sum of One hundred dollars by bond bearing date with these presents which debt with legal interest thereon the said William Johnson is willing and desirous to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum aforesaid for the further Consideration of One dollar to the said William Johnson in hand paid by the said Jacob H. Duck at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William Johnson hath given granted bargained and sold unto these presents to give good bargain and sell unto the said Jacob H. Duck his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit: One bay mare and colt there being of Calves thirty head of hogs two grresher beds and furniture and One Cart and wheel. To have and to hold the said property above mentioned unto him the said Jacob H. Duck his heirs and assigns forever. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Jacob H. Duck as soon as conveniently can after the first day of January 1682 and having advertised the time and place of sale of said property by three several advertisements to be posted up at the most publick places in the said County.
