Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said Mills & Sumner in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of One dollar to him by the said Mrs. & Sobell in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Mrs. & Sobell the following property to wit: One Cow and calf 12 head of hogs One bay mare & foal her and furniture and all the other household and kitchen furniture & cart and wheels the crop of Corn and fodder now growing on the plantation on which the said Sumner now lives. To have and to hold the said property unto him the said Mrs. & Sobell his Executors administrators and assigns forever. Upon the following trust and confidence that if the said Sumner when thereto required the said Sobell his Executors or assigns shall fail to pay the debt aforesaid due the said Sobell or those above mentioned for which he is security or either or any part thereof and also all costs attending this Indenture it shall be the duty of the said Mrs. & Sobell (or in case of his death for his legal personal representatives who is hereby authorized to act) upon being required so to do by the said Sobell his Executors or assigns to make sale of the property aforesaid hereby conveyed at public auction to the highest bidder for Cash or upon such other terms as the parties may agree upon being first on the day and place of sale at his own discretion and given reasonable public notice, and out of the proceeds of said sale pay and satisfy the said costs and expenses thereof and of this conveyance then the net and cleared monies due the said Sobell and the balance apply to the payment of the debts for which the said Sobell is the said Sumner's security and on release the said Sobell such amount if any which the said Sobell may have been compelled to pay as security. And if any surplus should then remain pay over to the said Sumner. And it is hereby agreed that the said Sumner shall retain possession of the property herein before conveyed and to take the profits thereof to his own use until the said Mrs. & Sobell shall proceed to sell according to the provisions of this act.
