~~First Indenture~~ made this 28th of July in the year Eighteen hundred and forty
one between Benjamin William Bartham of the first part Thomas Ridley of the second part and
Joseph H Bartham of the third part. Whereas the said B. William Bartham is greatly indebted to
the said Joseph H Bartham in the sum of \$51.00 due and payable on the 3^d February 1837
and bearing date the 1st February 1837 the payment whereof the said B. William Bartham is unable to
make and whereas the said Joseph H Bartham has become security to the said William Bartham
in a bond to the administrator of Mrs. David Murray for the sum of about \$45.00 due not paid
also to a bond to John A. Bentley Esq. of John Anderson Esq. for \$11.00 due not redacted also
to a bond to Sterling H. Currier for \$45.00 and to a bond to Mary Briggs Esq. of John A. Bentley
Esq. for about \$71.25 and also to a bond to Samuel Blunt for \$30.00 due not redacted and that
the said Bartham is desirous to indemnify and secure the said J. H. Bartham against all
and injury from the said securities; Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in con-
sideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by
said J. Ridley the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said B. H. Bartham
by these presents grants bargain sell and convey unto the said J. Ridley his heirs and
assigns, the following property to wit: One sowed Mow one hay mow two sows and their
pigs his growing crop of Corn pasture and cotton one good one clock farming plow
and his household and kitchen furniture together with all other property that he may
at present have or be possessed of. To have and to hold to him the said J. Ridley
his heirs and assigns forever and the said B. H. Bartham for himself his heirs and
administrators do covenant with the said J. Ridley his heirs and assigns that
he the said B. H. Bartham will and his heirs Executors and administrators shall warrant
and defend the same to the said J. Ridley his heirs and assigns forever against the
lawful claims & demands of all persons whatsoever: Upon Trust nevertheless
that the said J. Ridley his heirs or assigns shall permit the said B. H. Bartham or
in quest and peaceable possession of the above named property until default be made in
the said sum of money in whole or in part and then upon this further trust that the
said J. Ridley shall and will so soon after the happening of such default as may be
he shall be requested by the said J. H. Bartham his Executors administrators assigns
as to all said property or such part thereof as shall be sufficient for the purpose
