This Indenture made and entered into this 26th day of Oct. 1841 between Brong P. Lee of the first part. Howell McSmore of the second part and Rev. M. J. Dunster of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas the said Lee is justly indebted to the said Dunster in the sum of Eighty five dollars due this day and is willing and desiring to secure the payment thereof to him the said Dunster. This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Howell McSmore at and before the sealing and delivery hereof the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Brong P. Lee hath given granted bargained and sold, and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said Howell McSmore all the property belonging to the said Lee consisting of the following articles to wit - 2 cows and 10 pigs 11 sheep 1 horse 1 Brood waggon and harness 2 southern beds and furniture 1 Barrel Brandy 1 wheel 1 Double two small Tables 9 chairs 1 chest of drawers kitchen furniture of every description 2 stoves 1 black powder 1 stove of cast 1 set of Cider barrels 2 barbed stoves 1 plough and 3 ploughs heavy 1 pair traces 5 working hoes 1 barrel hoe entire crop of tobacco cotton and corn all his plates silver knives and forks cups saucers and spoons 1 Looking glass 1 Trunk a lot of pens and pencils 10 books 30 chickens 1 spinning wheel and a pair cards 1 sword and 1 shot gun to have the said Howell McSmore his heirs and assigns forever upon trust nevertheless that if the said Brong P. Lee should
