

Marriage Contract between his late wife Rebecca Jones and himself say in land negroes stock of all kinds consisting of hogs cattle hogs crops of all kinds household and kitchen furniture in fact his entire interest in said life estate which he the said Mr. L. Coville became entitled to from and by virtue of the marriage Contract aforesaid together with all improvements and advantages of every kind whatsoever unto him the said Jesse Drury trustee the said Mr. L. Coville doth by these presents warrant and power define against the claim of himself and against the claim and demand of all and every other person or persons unto him the said Jesse Drury trustee for the purpose and conditions hereafter named (Viz) that the said Jesse Drury shall suffer the said Mr. L. Coville to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the property aforesaid and also suffer him to dispose of any of his present crops and apply the proceeds to the payment of any or either of the above debts until the first day of August 1842 unless said Coville prefers the sale of the property sooner and then upon instructions found him at any time from and after the date hereof he the said Jesse Drury trustee shall proceed to give two days or more at one or more public places in the neighborhood of the land used place of sale and proceed to sell for cash the life estate hereby secured by receiving from all purchasers a bond to be executed by them to return at the death of said Coville the property as bought or its value to him the said Coville children by his late wife Rebecca J or their Guardians &c and out of the proceeds of such sale first pay all expenses attending the sale and carrying into effect this deed and then pay and distribute the balance to the creditors and securities agreeable to their ^{debts} debts and if he the said Jesse Drury trustee shall not be so instructed to sell by said Coville between this and the 1st day of August 1841 then it shall be lawful for all or either of the creditors hereby secured to instruct him the said Jesse Drury and he is hereby authorized by such instructions to proceed as above mentioned to give such notice and sell as above directed, pay the expenses and the creditors' ⁱⁿ securities the whole amounts that may be due them or so much as the sale of the property may be sufficient to pay such to receive in proportion to the amount due him or he may be bound for. —
