

Suppose One double gig and harness One single gig and harness two carts two pair oxen
 wheels One saddle lot of Coin say two hundred barrels fourteen stacks blue paper one
 One Stack Oats all the above named Articles of property being in the County of Southampton
 and State of Virginia on the plantation formerly owned by Nicholas Edwards now the
 property of Benjamin Edwards. To have and to hold the aforesaid property unto
 him the said Nicholas Bond his heirs and assigns forever. Upon trust nevertheless
 and for the uses intents and purposes hereinafter mentioned (That is to say) That
 the said Nicholas Bond or his legal representative may and shall at any time
 after the 20th Instant (December) being requested by either of the parties, sell at
 public sale for ready money the above named Articles of property by first giving ten day
 notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement pasted up in at least three public
 places in the aforesaid County of Southampton and out of the proceeds of such sale
 first pay all reasonable expences incurred in the recording and carrying interest
 these proceeds secondly pay unto the said John B Sherrod the before mentioned bond
 or Claim together with the legal interest which may have accrued thereon and the
 balance if any pay over to the order of the said James Sherrod or his assigns
 And witness whereof us the parties have hereunto set our hands and seals this day and date above written

Know all men by these presents that we William L. Edwards Esquire James B Sherrod
 William B Sherrod James W Parker and Nicholas M Sherrod we and jointly bound unto
 John Nathaniel Esq Lieutenant Governor acting pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution
 as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the just and full sum of thirty thousand
 dollars to be paid to the said acting Governor and his successors in the Office of Governor
 for the use of the Commonwealth for the payment whereof well and truly to be made we
 bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs Executors and administrators jointly
 and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and date this 20th day of December 1841
 The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound William L. Edwards
 is constituted and appointed Sheriff of the County of Southampton by a Commission from
 the Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution
 under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the tenth day of December 1841.
 At Therefore the said William L. Edwards shall well and truly collect all Taxes
 and proceeds and account for and pay the same in such manner as is by
 Law directed and also all fines penalties and amercements accruing or being
 due to the Commonwealth in the said County and shall duly account for and pay
 the same to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth and take manner as is by Law
 directed in case of public Taxes and shall in all things duly and faithfully execute
