Know all men by these presents that we William L. Ewerle Governor of the State of Virginia do hereby certify that we have and do give to the said John Rutherford Esq. Lieutenant Governor acting pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the just and full sum of thirty thousand dollars to be paid to the said acting Governor and his successor in the office of Governor for the use of the Commonwealth for the payment whereof we and each of us bind ourselves and each of us our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the 20th day of December 1841

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above named William L. Ewerle is constituted and appointed Sheriff of the County of Southampton by a Commission from the Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 20th day of December 1841. If therefore the said William L. Ewerle shall truly and faithfully collect account for and pay the taxes imposed by Law and arrears of Taxes due in the said County of Southampton we shall truly and faithfully collect account for and pay the militia fines imposed by Law and arrears of Militia fines due in the said County of Southampton then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue -

This Indenture made and entered into this 17th day of November 1841 by and between Jacob Barney of the one part and John Harbottle of the other part each of whom reside in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred dollars in hand paid by the said John Harbottle to him the said Jacob Barney at and before the delivery and making of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by the said Jacob Barney with Jacob Grant Curquin and all unto him the said John Harbottle a certain Lot or parcel of Land the same being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and supposed to contain about Eleven Acres be the same more or less and bounded by the Survey the following named parties to wit. John Bartholomew Poly Jackson and James Williams Not being the Land which said Barney purchased of said Poly Jackson with all the right title interest and Estate which he the said Barney has heretofore had in and to the above described Land to him the said John Harbottle his heirs and assigns forever. To have and to hold the said Lot or parcel of Land and every part thereof free from the Claim of him the said Jacob Barney his heirs and assigns forever and also free from the Claim of all and every person whomsoever
