This Indenture made this 18th day of December in the year of Our Lord 1821 between
 Rindred Jackson of the first part of Southampton County and State of Virginia and James
 Jeynes of the second part and James Jackson of the third part both of the County and State
 aforesaid whereas the said Rindred Jackson is justly indebted to the said James Jackson in or
 about of three hundred and eighty five dollars and 55 Cents due on the eighteenth day of
 December Eighteen hundred and forty One with lawful interest until paid the said
 Rindred Jackson is willing and desirous to secure. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that
 for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar
 of Lawful Money of Virginia to the said Rindred Jackson in hand paid by the said James
 Jeynes at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged but the said Rindred Jackson hath given granted bargain sold released
 and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sold release and confirm
 to the said James Jeynes and his heirs and assigns forever the following property being
 in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being more described the property
 particular One sordid black queer horse One cream mare and one cream geld
 twenty two head of Cattle thirty five head of hogs two shot guns two pairs of cut
 wheels six feather beds one saddle and bridle and all my household and kitchen
 furniture mine blade storks and my crop for the next year here specifying the
 property particular with all and singular the appurtenances to the said parcel of
 property belonging or in anywise appertaining and all the whole right title and interest
 of the said Rindred Jackson in and to the said granted or intended to be hereby
 granted parcel of property. To have and to hold to the said James Jeynes and
 intended to be hereby granted parcel of property hereby conveyed unto the said James
 Jeynes his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever to the only purpose use
 and behoof of ... the said James Jeynes his heirs Executors administrators and assigns
 forever and the said Rindred Jackson for himself his heirs Executors and
 administrators doth hereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said
 James Jeynes his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever in manner
 and form that is to say that the said Rindred Jackson his heirs Executors
 and administrators the aforesaid parcel of property hereby conveyed unto the said James
 Jeynes his heirs Executors and administrators and assigns against all persons whom
 shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents upon trust nevertheless
 that the said James Jeynes his heirs Executors administrators shall permit the said
 Rindred Jackson to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said parcel of
 property hereby conveyed and take the property thereof as his own and would expect
 be made in the payment of the said bond of three hundred and eighty five dollars
 and 55 Cents with legal interest either in the whole or in part and there upon the
 Jackson bind that they or any two or either of them or the survivor of them or the
 their Executors administrators or assigns of such survivor shall and will do and after
