

the happening of such default of payment as they or any or either of them or the survivors of them or the heirs executors administrators or assigns of such survivor may think or the said James Jackson his heirs executors administrators or assigns shall request all the said above mentioned property hereby conveyed or such part of the hereby granted property as the trustee or his representative hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose and shall thence proceed to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction and give legal notice thereof in one or more of the news papers printed in said state and also notify the same by advertisement to be set up at the door of the Courthouse of aforesaid county on some court day preceding to the day of sale and out of the money arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Thomas Jackson his executors administrators and assigns the said sum of three hundred and eighty five dollars and 50 Cents with the interest which may thereon lawfully have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the said Thomas Jackson his heirs executors administrators or assigns. But if the whole of the said sum of three hundred and eighty five dollars and 50 Cents with its legal interest shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said James Jackson his executors administrators or assigns when the same is payable so that on default of payment of the said bond be made then this indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue. Edwards~~ made the 7th day of Oct. 1841 between Mills & Lawrence and Solomon Crumpler of the County of Sol of right and state of Virginia of the one part and George W. Crumpler of the same County of the other part; Witnesseth that the said Mills & Lawrence and Solomon Crumpler for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and Twelve dollars and fifty cents to them in hand paid by the said George W. Crumpler at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged thus bargained and sold unto by these presents the bargain and sell were conveyed to the said George W. Crumpler his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land and ground lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows (to wit) at a Corner tree a white Oak a Corner tree of Robert Adams line in Swamps thence along a line of Marked trees to a measuring post to a pine a Corner tree of Robert Adams and Jordan Springs line thence along a line of Marked trees to a light house post a Corner post of Thomas Whitting line thence along a line of Marked trees to Swamps thence up said swamp to the first station containing by estimation One hundred and twenty Acre & Co the same more or less it being the same plantation that the said Solomon Crumpler formerly owned and bounded by the lands of
