

indulge to the said John Vick in the just and full sum of four hundred and seventy seven dollars, due by bond bearing date with these obligating witnesses that the said Gilbert Drury is willing to secure the said John Vick which is the act and deed of these parents both granted bargain sold and conveyed unto the said James Vick his heirs or assigns the following property to wit One Certain Tract of Land and premises lying and being in the County aforesaid and bounded as follows on the west by the land of Solomon Boykins heirs, as a life right on the north by round hill swamp on the south by Shugart Lewis and James Hargrett, leads to the beginning containing by a old survey two hundred and thirty seven acres by the same more or less also my stock of cattle horse crop of corn and garden hops and household and kitchen furniture with my farming utensils I convey unto the said James Vick his heirs or assigns forever but upon this special trust and consideration that the said James Vick his heirs or assigns shall make sale of the above mentioned property at public for the best price that can be obtained any time after the second day of February 1842 after advertising two days previous to the day of sale at the Court House door and other public places in the neighborhood and with the money arising from said sales first pay the said John Vick all his just claims and expenses thereof in making sale of said property and the overplus - if any pay to the said Gilbert Drury and his heirs, and the said Gilbert Drury for himself his heirs or assigns do warrant and forever defend against any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof and the said James Vick his heirs or assigns do agree to make sale of the above mentioned property any time when requested by the said John Vick his heirs or assigns. This Indenture made and entered into this second day of August One thousand Eight hundred and forty One between Robert Lundy of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Richard Williams of the aforesaid County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar in hand paid the receipt whereof the said Robert Lundy with hereby acknowledges the said Robert Lundy both granted bargain sold and conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien and confirmed unto the said Richard Williams his heirs and assigns One Certain Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County and State aforesaid and bounded as follows - Beginning at a black gum corner in said R. Williams line thence along his line to a white oak (a new corner) thence along said line to a pine in said Branch a corner. Thence down said Branch as it means to the Spring Branch - thence along said Spring Branch to the beginning - Containing by estimation Eighty two Acres by the same more or less with all trees woods ways waters water courses common rights hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in anywise appertaining the reversion or reversions remainder or remainders rents issues and profits thereof and also the whole right title interest property claim or demand whatsoever of said premises
