

Handwritten: This Indenture made this 27th day of Novr. One thousand eight hundred and forty one
 between Richard Hurrey and wife of the the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the
 one part and Martha Murrell of the said County and state of the other part, Witness that the said
 Richard Hurrey and Jane his wife for and in consideration of the sum of twenty pounds lawful
 money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid or secured to be paid by the
 said Martha Murrell at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold unto by these presents the receipt
 lack of them bargain and sell unto the said Martha Murrell one certain tract or parcel
 of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and state of Virginia on the
 North side of Great swamp bounded by the lands of the heirs of Miller's Farming and
 runs parallel with Great swamp containing by estimation thirty acres more or less the same
 more or less all the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Land. To have and to
 hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the appurtenances unto the said Martha
 Murrell her heirs and assigns forever and the said Richard Hurrey and his wife Jane
 do for themselves their heirs warrant and forever defend the right and title of the said
 Lands unto the said Martha Murrell her heirs and assigns forever. And Witness whereof

 eight hundred and forty two between Jackson W. Scott of the first part of Southampton of the one
 part and William Pole of the other part: Whereas the said Jackson W. Scott is justly indebted
 to the said William Pole in the sum of four hundred and twelve dollars and by simple bill
 or specialty payable on demand and bearing date with these presents which debt and
 the legal interest which may thereon accrue the said Jackson W. Scott is willing
 and desirous to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of
 the premises and also for the further consideration of One dollar lawful money of
 Virginia to the said Jackson W. Scott in hand paid by the said J. D. Magensberg the
 said Jackson W. Scott hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents
 doth grant bargain and sell to the said J. D. Magensberg his heirs and assigns forever
