This Indenture made this 21st Day of February in the year of our Lord 1842 between Anthony A. Melville of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the One part, and Caroline E. Melville of the other part, Witnesseth that the said A. A. Melville as well for and in Consideration of the natural love and affection which he has and bears for his wife the said Caroline E. Melville, his son Benjamin Thomas Melville, an infant now living and also in Consideration of a desire to provide for all such children as he may have living at the time of his death by his wife lawfully begotten as of five dollars to him in hand paid at the time of sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged both given granted sold and confirmed unto by these presents both give grant sell and confirmed unto the said Caroline E. Melville all my right title and interest in the Estate to which I may be entitled in right of my said wife in the Estate of her father. Over in the possession of her Mother (who is entitled to hold the same during her natural life) To have and to hold the said property of every sort or kind docket to the said Caroline E. Melville upon the following Trust. That after my death she is to hold the same during her widowhood charged with a support to such Child or Children as she may have by me living at that time and also upon the further Trust that upon her marriage or death the Estate shall pass to such Child or Children as may be living at that time, And the said A. A. Melville for himself and his heirs, doth Covenant promise and agree to and with the said Caroline E. Melville, That he the said A. A. Melville and his heirs the said property or interest in the Estate above described unto her the said Caroline E. Melville and her heirs and all other persons whomsoever shall and will by these presents warrant and forever defend for themself whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day and of your above written -

 two between William C. Ponder of the first part Jesse L. Bailey of the second part both of the
 County of Southampton and State of Virginia and John A. Hill of the said County of the
 third part. Witnesseth that the said William C. Ponder for and in consideration of the sum
 of One hundred dollars which said sum is due from the said Hill, Ponder to the said John A.
 Hill by bond bearing date the 21st day of February 1842. as well as all other moneys which may
 be due and owing from the said W. C. Ponder to the said John A. Hill by means of any
 dealing, transfer of debts or paper whatsoever as also for and in consideration of the sum of
 one dollar to him in hand paid by Jesse L. Bailey, the receipt whereof the said W. C. Ponder
 doth hereby acknowledged both bargained and sold and by these presents doth hereby
 grant bargain and sell convey and make over unto the said Jesse L. Bailey and his
 heirs, forever, all my right and title in a tract of land purchased of Lewis O. Braxton
 and bounded by the lands of Newt Branch and William Jenkins and other persons this
 special trust notwithstanding that the said Jesse L. Bailey being thereof requested by the said
 John A. Hill proceeded to sell the aforesaid tract of land hereby conveyed after receiving
