Benton & Clayton made this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of Decr. One thousand eight hundred and forty  
 One between James E Clayton and Unity A his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and  
 Joseph Proctor of the County of Gloucester the other part, all of the state of Virginia, witnesseth that the  
 said James E Clayton and Unity A his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of four hundred  
 twenty eight dollars and fifty seven Cents to them in hand paid or otherwise received by the said  
 Joseph Proctor at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby  
 acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold unto the said presents with grant buying and  
 selling enfranchised unto the said Joseph Proctor and to his heirs and assigns from  
 all our interest in one certain tract or parcel of Land containing by Estimation three hundred  
 and a fifty seven acres to the sume more or less (except one acre for growing) it being the  
 land formerly belonging to Willis of Dole d<sup>r</sup> including that tract called Morning and  
 bounded on the East by the main run of black water swamp on the North by the lines of  
 Nathaniel Brantshaw Henry Holloman and Arthur Holloman on the West and South west  
 by the Taripin Swamp and South by Proctors Run, together with all trees woods unwooding  
 bushes commodities advantages hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land  
 belonging or in any wise appertaining and also the reversion and reversionary  
 remanency rights and titles of the said premises and every part thereof and the estate  
 right till interest claim and demand whosoever of them the said James E Clayton and  
 Unity A his wife or their heirs (except the one acre as above named of us to the said  
 premises or any part thereof. To have and to hold all and singular the premises above  
 mentioned and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Joseph  
 Proctor his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Joseph  
 Proctor his heirs and assigns forever and the said James E Clayton and Unity A his wife their  
 heirs of. The premises above mentioned and every part thereof unto the said Joseph Proctor his  
 heirs and assigns, shall and will warrant and forever defend the right of the lands above mentioned  
 against them and their heirs and every other person or persons claiming by these presents  
 And witness whereof the said James E Clayton and Unity A his wife have hereunto set  
 their hands and seals this day and date first above written

 in the County aforesaid and State of Virginia do hereby certify that Unity A Clayton the  
 wife of James E Clayton party to a certain deed for the Conveyance of Real Estate to Joseph  
 Proctor of the County aforesaid bearing date this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1841 and her to  
 annexed personally appeared before us in our County and State aforesaid and being examined  
 by us privily and apart from her husband and having acknowledged the said aforesaid fully  
 to be her act and deed and whereas she had willingly signed and sealed the same and  
 that she wished not to retract it. We under our hands and seals this 20<sup>th</sup> day of December 1841
