 A. Turner hath granted bargained and sold unto by these presents with grant bargain
 and sell unto the said Henry Bridges his heirs and assigns the following property (to wit) One
 of Corn, fowls and peas two sows and fourteen pigs - To have and to hold the said
 property herein conveyed unto the said Henry Bridges his heirs Executors administrators and
 assigns, in trust and upon Conditions that at any time after the first day of November
 next at the request of the said Matthew Hurrup it shall be lawful for the said Henry
 Bridges (or in case of his death for his legal personal representative who is hereby
 authorized to act) to make sale of the property above mentioned at public auction
 to the highest bidder for Cash having given reasonable public notice of the time and
 place of sale and out of the proceeds in the first place to discharge all legal and usual
 costs and expenses attending the sale and this conveyance then pay to Matthew Hurrup
 his heirs Executors administrators or assigns the above bond and interest and if any
 surplus should then remain pay it over to the said John A. Turner. And the said
 John A. Turner doth hereby Covenant with the said Henry Bridges that he will
 forever warrant the same against all persons whatsoever - In Testimony whereof the
