

Messrs Henry made out the 26th day of March 1834 and payable on the first day of January
 1837 for the sum of five hundred and forty six dollars and sixty three Cents and the said
 John Gyles being desirous to secure to the said Joseph T. Blount the amount of the above named
 bond and interest and also to secure the said Joseph T. Blount as his security to the bond to the said
 Henry Messrs and interest and for and in Consideration of the sum of One dollar in hand
 paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by
 the said John Gyles, and the said John Gyles of the first part hath granted bargain
 sold aliened and Conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien and
 Conveys to the said William L. Everett his heirs and assigns the following property to wit
 a tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Greene containing five hundred and fifty
 Acres more or less it being the same on which the said Gyles now residing is and
 adjoining the lands of the heirs of Robert T. Magraw on the North the lands of Benjamin
 Ellis on the West Samuel B. Woodward and Nathaniel Francis on the South and John Bost
 on the East &c and also the following negro slaves to wit Saml. Finch Dennis and three
 and found with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of Land
 belonging or in any wise appertaining and all the right title and interest of the said
 John Gyles in and to the said granted or intended to be hereby granted tract or parcel
 of Land and premises and the negro slaves as before mentioned. To have and to hold
 the said hereby granted tract or parcel of Land and premises ^{or intended to be hereby granted} together with the before
 named Slaves unto the said William L. Everett his heirs Executors administrators and
 assigns forever. Upon this special Trust that the said William L. Everett upon being
 thereto requested by the said Joseph T. Blount his heirs Executors administrators or assigns
 shall make sale of the said tract or parcel of Land before Conveyed or intended to be
 Conveyed at publick auction to the highest bidder for Cash and also the before named
 Slaves, having first fixed on the time and place of sale at his own discretion and
 given at least fifteen days notice thereof by advertisement to be stuck up at one or
 more publick places in the neighbourhood and out of the moneys arising from such
 sale first pay and discharge the Costs and Expences attending the sale of the Conveyance
 and then pay and discharge the debts of record due to the said Joseph T. Blount and
 Henry Messrs and the interest which may have accrued thereon or so much thereof as
 may be due at the time of the sale and the surplus if any pay over to the said John
 Gyles his heirs Executors administrators or assigns &c and the said John Gyles hereby covenants
 and agrees with the said William L. Everett that he will warrant and defend a full
 simple interest in the before named tract of Land and Slaves conveyed or intended
 to be conveyed and the said William L. Everett covenants and agrees with the other parties
 that he will well and faithfully execute the trust reposed in him. His Testimony whereof the
 parties aforesaid have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and
 year first before written.
