Shilly of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia have got and in Consideration of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Benj^a & Pope of the said County and State at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold granted and confirmed and by these presents do bargain sell grant and confirm to the said Benj^a & Pope all the right title interest and Estate which I have or might have had in right of my wife Rachel whose maiden name was Rachel Pope of in and to the said slaves and other personal property appurtenant to Elizabeth Pope as dower in her late husband John Pope Estate. To have and to hold the said interest in both slaves and other personal property described as aforesaid to the only proper use and behoof of the said Benj^a & Pope his Executors Admins and assigns forever, And I the said Wm. Shilly for myself my Executors Admins the said slaves and other estate as aforesaid to the said Benj^a & Pope his Executors Admins and assigns against me the said Wm. Shilly my Executors Admins and assigns and vs. all and every other person and persons whatsoever shall and well warrant and force defend by these presents. And Witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and forty two.

This deed of bargain and sale from Wm. Shilly to Benjamin & Pope was proved by all the witnesses thereto and submitted to Record -

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This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of March in the year of our Lord 1842 between Mylie H. Morris of the County of Southampton of the first part James & Pledge of the second William H. Morris of the third part John H. Morris and George H. Morris of the third part. The two former of Southampton the two latter of England and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that whereas the said Mylie H. Morris is justly indebted to the said William H. Morris the sum of fifty more dollars to have been paid the 1st day of January 1842 as by a bond bearing date the same day also the sum of thirty dollars in open account and a bond of forty dollars bearing date the year 1838 and the sum of twenty dollars for which he is my security to have been paid the first of January 1842 to the said John H. Morris twenty dollars for which he is my security to have been paid the first of January 1842 and to George H. Morris the sum of five dollars to have been paid the 1st day of January 1841 more fully appears, And the said Mylie H. Morris in order to secure and save the above aforesaid money do agree before the witnesses to convey the following property to wit - One mare and increase 3 head of cattle & head of hogs 1 Cart and wheels (old) fender bacon household and kitchen furniture and every other article that he is at this time in possession of. To have and to hold to the said James & Pledge his agents Executors or administrators upon express covenants and no other. And if the said Mylie H. Morris should in or before the first day of August next pay the several amounts heretofore and of all the expenses attending the execution thereof together with the interest which there lawfully have accrued then this Indenture and every thing herein contained to be null and void but if on the other hand the said Morris should fail at the aforesaid time to pay and discharge the aforesaid mentioned money and interest together with the expenses attending the execution thereof then at the request of any of the parties (except the trustee the said James
