Witness that the said John Dick and Polly his wife in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty five dollars lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Arrington Barner at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold unto by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Arrington Barner his heirs and assigns One certain tract or parcel of Land together with all and singular and appurtenances thereto belonging and bounded as follows to wit Commencing at the quarter road North thence South a line of marked trees between William Davis and said Land to a corner in said Davis line thence South to Samuel Sension's land thence line of marked trees between said Sension and Drury to a corner thence East a line of marked trees between John Rogers and said Land to a corner in James B. Long line thence between said Long land a line of marked trees N. E. to the quarter road thence up the said road to the beginning. Containing by a late survey One hundred and 3 Acres by the same more or less. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said Arrington Barner his heirs or assigns to his use and use forever and the said John Dick and his wife Polly his heirs and assigns for ever do warrant themselves and their heirs free from the Claim of them the said John Dick and Polly his wife and their heirs and of us and any other person claiming or claiming the same or any part thereof.
