To have and to hold the said parcel of land together with all the appurtenances therunto belonging or in any way appertaining free from the claim or claims of me the said William M. Nicholson or any other person or persons whatsoever unto the said Joseph Drury his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Mr. Nicholson or any other person or persons whatsoever unto the said Joseph Drury his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Mr. Nicholson for himself his heirs and assigns to hereby warrant and defend the right and title in and to the said parcel of Land unto the said Joseph Drury his heirs or assigns forever. This Indenture made this 25th day of December Anno Domini Eight hundred and forty One between John Dicks and Polly his wife of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part and Arlington Governor of the aforesaid County and State of the other part. Witnesseth That the said John Dicks and Polly his wife in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty five dollars lawful money of Virginia to him and her paid by the said Arlington Governor at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged had bargained and sold and by these presents do bargains and sell unto the said Arlington Governor his heirs and assigns One certain tract or parcel of Land bounded with all and singular and appurtenances thereto belonging and bounded as follows to wit Commencing at the greatest road North corner South a line of marked trees between William Davis and said Land to a corner in said Davis' line thence South to Samuel Dinson's land thence East a line of marked trees between said Davis and Dinson to a corner thence East a line of marked trees between John Dicks and said Dinson to a corner in James & Long's line thence between said Long's land a line of marked trees N.C. to the greatest road thence up the said road to the beginning containing by a late survey One hundred and three acres be the same more or less. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said Arlington Governor his heirs and assigns to his use and service forever and the said John Dicks and his wife Polly his heirs and assigns for themselves to warrant themselves and their heirs free from the claim of him the said John Dicks and Polly his wife and their heirs and of all and every other person claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof.
