This Indenture made this 4th day of March 1842 between Hartwell Pope of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and John Drury of the said County of State of Virginia and Samuel Drury of said County and State of the second part, Whereas the said Hartwell Pope is justly indebted to the said Samuel Drury in the sum of four hundred and fifty two dollars and ninety six Cents to be paid on the fourth day of June Eighteen hundred and forty two as by bond bearing date with these presents more fully appearing which debt the said Hartwell Pope is willing and desirous to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of One dollar to the said Hartwell Pope in hand paid by the said John Drury at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Hartwell Pope have given granted bargained and sold released and Confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain sell release and Confirm unto John Drury his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing One hundred and twenty seven acres be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of David Porter Lewis Harris and the lands belonging to the Estate of Thos. Applewhite and unto appear more fully it being the land the said Hartwell Pope now residing on. Also One negro man named Sam and One negro woman named Jenny also two boys and all other household and Kitchen furniture which the said Pope has now in possession also two horses seven head of Cattle twenty five barbed Cows three thousand pounds black and twelve head of hogs and about the same amount of Corn and feed to be consumed then as much as the said Pope has on hand. If so much he has at the time this deed is instrumented with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract of land belonging in in any wise appurtening and all the Estate right title and interest of the said Hartwell Pope in the said tract or parcel of Land and the said negro and other property before named which is hereby intended to be conveyed unto the said John Drury his heirs Executors and administrators or assigns and the said Hartwell Pope for himself his heirs Executors or administrators doth hereby Covenant and agree to and with the said John Drury his heirs and assigns forever to warrant and forever defend the right title and interest in and unto the said tract of Land with all the longest Mortmain belonging as well as the right
