

tell and interest in and unto the negro man Sam. Drury and Horace Cullen
 all other property before named and hereby intending to be conveyed unto the said John
 Drury his heirs Executors or assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant
 and favour defend by their presents upon trust nevertheless that the said John
 Drury his heirs Executors or assigns shall permit the said Horace Cullen to remain
 in quiet and peaceable possession of the said tract of land together with the said
 slaves and all other property hereby intended to be conveyed and to suffer the profits
 thereof to his own use until default be made in the said sum of four hundred
 and fifty two dollars and ninety six Cents either in the whole or in part and
 thereupon this further trust that he the said John Drury his Executors or assigns
 shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment at the request
 of the said Samuel Drury his Executors or assigns sell the said tract or parcel of
 land and premises together with the above said slaves, seven head Cattle two horses
 and kitchen furniture corn fodder and hogs or such part of the hereby granted
 property as the said trustee shall think sufficient for the purpose and shall think
 proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public sale after giving
 ten days notice of the time and place at three different public places and out
 of the moneys arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and
 all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Samuel Drury his heirs Executors
 or assigns the said sum of four hundred and fifty two dollars and ninety six
 Cents and the interest which may thereon lawfully have accrued of the 1st day
 of Jan 1822 and the balance if any shall pay to the said Horace Cullen his
 heirs Executors or assigns but if the whole of the said sum of four hundred and fifty
 two dollars and ninety six Cents with all legal interest together with all costs
 attending these premises be fully discharged and no default be made of the said
 sum interest and costs then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force
