Doyle for and in consideration that Messrs Gordon and Stone have compromised with us and accordingly delivered into our hands all evidence of our indebtedness to said Gordon & Stone and have fully discharged us from all our indebtedness have bargained and sold and by their parents have delivered to said Nash and Doyle unto the said Gordon and Stone one hundred and fifty bushels of No. 2 black-eyed peas the same being the quantity now in the possession of said Gordon and Stone together delivered by us to them and no further transfer signs and set our notes the said Gordon and Stone the following notes and accounts specified as follows -
