both of the same County and state of the third part. Marshall that whereas the said  
Exam<sup>d</sup> & Drd. David Mason and Ann Prince having become Security for the said David Mason in his  
to St. Westbrook administration bond of the Estate of Martha Mason dec<sup>d</sup> which bond was taken by the  
Court of Southampton County Court for the sum of two thousand <sup>one hundred</sup> dollars and was filed  
in the Clerkly Office as well more fully appear by reference to said bond by the same man
