

This Indenture

made this 2^d day of September 1821 between Eli Coker of the County of Southampton of the one part and Alexander M. Coker of the said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Eli Coker for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to him in hand paid or otherwise secured hath granted bargained and sold one certain tract of land containing two hundred and seventeen acres be the same more or less situate lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded by the lines of William Briggs, Thompson King and Miles Hartough. Also all trees woods underwoods Common Common of pasture people Commodities Accommodations Consumments and hereditaments whatsoever to the said tract of Land above mentioned belonging or in anywise appertaining or in any way upon the same growing happening or arising and also the reversion and reversions revenues and commodities rents and services of said premises and of any part and parcel thereof and also all the said legal title ^{interest} claims and demands whatsoever of him the said Eli Coker off in and to the said premises every part thereof. To have and to hold as and unto the said premises above mentioned to the only proper use and behoof of the said A. M. Coker his heirs and assigns forever and the said E. Coker for himself and his heirs the said tract of Land and every part thereof against himself and heirs and against all and every person and persons whatsoever to the said A. M. Coker his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. This Indenture made and entered into this 11th day of May 1822 between John A. Turner of the County of Southampton of the first part Nicholas M. Seibell of the second part and James Bell of the third part. Whereas the said John A. Turner is justly indebted to the said James Bell in the sum of Eighty two dollars and thirty two Cents with interest from 26th May 1821 till paid, and Out of said five dollars and forty two Cents. The payment whereof the said John A. Turner is desirous to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the promises and for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Nicholas M. Seibell the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said John A. Turner does by these presents grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Nicholas M. Seibell his heirs and assigns the following property to wit: A certain Tract of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid on the South side of the Highway containing two hundred and ninety five acres more or less being the same tract of Land which the said Turner purchased of Edmund Butts and wife by deed dated the 1st day of January 1820 and wherein the said John A. Turner now residing together with the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging. To have and to hold to him the said Nicholas M. Seibell his heirs and assigns forever and the said John A. Turner for himself his heirs Executors and administrators does covenant with the said Nicholas M. Seibell his heirs Executors and administrators and assigns that he the
