accrued thereon or so much as may then be due of said debt and the balance if any
shall pay to the said George Whipple his heirs Executors administrators or assigns. But if the
whole of the whole of the said debt being four hundred and fifty more dollars and fifty two
Cents with the interest thereon accruing shall be fully paid off and discharged to
the said Benjamin Phillips his Executors administrators or assigns on or before the
26th day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty four
so that no default of payment of the said debt be made then this indenture
to be void but if otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue. As witness

to Lucy his wife of the County of Norfolk and State of North Carolina of the one part and Josiah Merrill of
Merrill the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John
Dudley and Lucy his wife in consideration of the sum of One dollar to them in hand paid by the
said Josiah Merrill at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the
said Josiah Merrill his heirs and assigns all the right title interest and estate they have in and
to a certain tract or parcel of Land containing fifteen acres more or less being a parcel of
land held by the said John Dudley and Lucy his wife in which the the said Lucy and
her right joined the Estate of Thomas Bassard was bounded by the corner of the said Josiah Merrill
to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land before mentioned unto every part and parcel
thereof with every of their rights to the said Josiah Merrill his heirs and assigns forever to and
for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Josiah Merrill his heirs and assigns forever
