This Indenture made this 17th day of June in the year of Christ Our thousand eight hundred and forty two between River Barber of the first part Leston R. Edwards of the second part and William J. Morris of the third part whereas the said River Barber is justly indebted to the said William J. Morris in the sum of three thousand and eight One Hundred dollars due and payable by note bearing even date with these presents. And whereas the said River Barber is desirous to secure and hold agreed to secure the payment of the said debt and interest with all charges attending the same or incurred by reason of the premises by conveying the property therein after mentioned unto the said Leston R. Edwards. And that River Barber therefore this Indenture witnessed that the said River Barber in consideration of the premises and of the sum of ten dollars to him by the said trustee in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold confirmed assigned and made over. And does by these presents bargain and sell confirm assign and make over unto the said Leston R. Edwards his heirs Executors and administrators One Certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton containing by Estimation Two hundred and forty four and a fourth Acres more or less being the same tract of Land and which the said River Barber now owns and bounds by the land of John James James J. James Jesse Little & others with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract of Land belonging or in any wise appertaining likewise one negro man named Jim: Two head of horses and six head of Cattle and the increase of the said Horses and Cattle. To have and to hold the same and its appurtenances aforesaid together with the aforesaid slave Horses and Cattle unto the said Leston R. Edwards his heirs Executors administrators and assigns. For Trust and upon Condition nevertheless that the said River Barber shall retain possession of the property aforesaid and take the profits to his own use until the said Edwards shall be required by the said Morris his Executors &c to make and deliver for the payment of the said debt herein first before mentioned and upon being so required by the said Leston R. Edwards (or in case of his death for his legal personal representative lawfully authorized to act) shall after being paid in the day and place of sale at his own discretion and giving reasonable public notice. Sell at public auction to the highest bidder for Cash the same land and personal property aforesaid or so much thereof as shall be sufficient for the purpose. And out of the proceeds in the first place to discharge all legal and usual Costs and expenses attending
