Whereupon the said deed together with the Certificate annexed of the prior examination and acknowledgment of the wife is ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made this 20th day of February in the year 1802 between Robert & Co. Trusteys in a certain deed of trust made by Edward Drake in favour of John Wick and Amos P Drury of the first part and Nicholas A. Goble of the second part all of the County of Northampton. Whereas the said Robert Wick Trusteys having made sale of the land inclosed in and bounded by the aforesaid deed of trust according to the terms and provisions of the said deed, and the said named Nicholas A. Goble of the second part having become the purchaser. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Robert & Co. Trusteys for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and Eleven dollars lawful money of Virginia to him paid by the said Nicholas A. Goble the receipt whereof he the said Wick doth hereby acknowledge hath given granted bargained and sold and as of the premises gave grant bargain and sell unto the said Nicholas A. Goble a certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Northampton containing by survey One hundred and Eleven Acre more or less and bounded as follows to wit on the south by the land of Jeremiah Goble on the west by the land of John G. Henson and on the east by the land belonging to the land belonging to the orphan children of Joseph Drake and on the north by the land of Esauville Butler being the same tract or parcel of land described
