Vick as trustee for himself his heirs and assigns with Covenant with the said Nicholas St. Pierre his heirs and assigns that the above granted premises are free from all incumbrances by him created and that he has a good and perfect right to convey the same as aforesaid and that he will use his heirs and assigns shall warrant and defend such title to the aforesaid granted premises as may be needed in him as trustee to the said Nicholas St. Pierre his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons. Answers. This Indenture made and entered into 20th day of June 1842 between Isaac Amos of the first part of the County of Southampton and Mrs. Williams of the County aforesaid of the second part and between Hilbert W. Vick of the County of Suffolk of the third part sheweth whereas the aforesaid Isaac Amos did on the 25th day of December last become personally bound unto the aforesaid Hilbert W. Vick by bond bearing date above mentioned that is to say on the 25th day of December 1841 in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars and whereas the said Isaac Amos is willing and anxious effectually to save himself and indemnify the said Hilbert W. Vick in his obligation against Obed the Indenture witness that the said Isaac Amos for and in consideration of the promise and of the sum of One dollar to him in money paid by the said Mrs. Williams the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has granted bargained and by these presents does grant bargain and sell unto the said Hilbert W. Vick the following property to wit One Negro boy named Braxton about 15 years old. To have and to hold the said Negro boy to him the said Mrs. Williams his heirs and assigns forever upon trust nevertheless the said Isaac Amos is to keep possession of the said Negro and to hold the same until the said Hilbert W. Vick shall think proper to order the sale of the aforesaid Negro and ordering the sale of the said Negro by the aforesaid Hilbert W. Vick the aforesaid Mrs. Williams trustee as aforesaid after advertising the time and place of sale not less than ten days at the Court House of the County of which the said Amos is a resident and other places in the vicinity of the place where the aforesaid sale shall take place shall offer said to the highest bidder the aforesaid Negro and shall pay first out of the proceeds the expenses of this trust and then the amount of the bond which the said Isaac Amos owing to the aforesaid Hilbert W. Vick and the balance if any pay over to the said Isaac Amos or his order and the said Mrs. Williams and promising he will truly and faithfully execute the said trust and whenever the said liability to wit will have ceased and terminated he will release and recover the property aforesaid unto the above mentioned Isaac Amos.
