This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of July in the year of our Lord 1842 between Edward M. Murrell of the first part Sampson & Rice of the second part and Joseph T. Blane of the third part all of the County of Southampton state of Virginia: Witnesseth that the said Edward M. Murrell for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand and seventy dollars which said sum is due from the said Edward M. Murrell by bond bearing date this 18th day of July 1842 and due the 25th day of September as also for and in consideration of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Sampson & Rice the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell convey and make over unto the said Sampson & Rice and his heirs and assigns forever One certain and gooder Cotton and branch of. To have and to hold all the said Crops of the said land herein conveyed to him the said Sampson & Rice his heirs &c. upon this special trust that the said Sampson & Rice upon being required by the said Joseph T. Blane shall proceed to sell all the said Crops of Cotton and branch of the said Murrell freely conveyed after advertising the time and place of sale for ten days previous at some public place or places for cash and out of the Money arising from the sale in the first place pay all costs attending the said sale as well as the expenses attending the said conveyance and the costs of appraisement and the surplus if any pay to the said Edward M. Murrell and the said Sampson & Rice on this part covenants and agrees that he will sell for the best price he can obtain for the said property if he is required to sell to pay the aforesaid debt But if the aforesaid Murrell shall satisfy and pay the aforesaid debt and interest when it becomes due this deed shall be void and of no effect otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
