*This Indenture* Made and entered into this thirtieth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty two between John H. Turner of the County of Albemarle and State of Virginia of the first part and William A. Sparks of the said County of the second part Witnesseth that whereas the said John H. Turner is anxious after the payment of all his just debts to provide a comfortable support for himself wife and children and to provide as far as he can against the contingencies which might deprive them of the means of such comfortable support. Now this Indenture therefore witnesseth that in consideration of the above recited premises and also of the further consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said William A. Sparks the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge but the said John H. Turner shall give granted bargain sell alien convey and confirm and by these presents for himself and his heirs doth give grant bargain sell alien convey release and confirm unto the said William A. Sparks his heirs Executors and administrators all his Estate both real and personal of whatever nature or kind or interest he may have therein with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging. Do have and to hold the same unto him the said William A. Sparks his heirs Executors and administrators forever. in trust nevertheless for the following use and purpose to wit first for the payment of all the just debts which are now owing and owing by him the said John H. Turner and for the use and benefit of him the said John H. Turner during his natural life for the support of himself and family and after his death the said Estate both real and personal to be divided as follows One third thereof both real and personal to be held and enjoyed by him the wife of the said John H. Turner during her natural life and after her death the same to be equally divided among the children of the said John H. Turner who may be then living and the heirs of such as may die leaving children lawfully begotten to be divided for Stumps and the other two thirds to be equally divided between the children of the said John H. Turner who may be living at his death and the heirs of such as may die leaving children lawfully begotten to be divided for Stumps And the said William A. Sparks doth hereby consent and agree with the said John H. Turner that he will stand seized and possessed of the real and personal Estate hereby conveyed for the special use as herein declared and expressed and none other. Hoaglin to the said Jesse Fitzham of the said County of Albemarle and State of Virginia the sum of One thousand eight hundred and forty two as well as all other moneys which may be due and owing from the said Benjamin H. Hoaglin to the said Jesse Fitzham
