This Indenture made this <sup>1st day of August Eighteen hundred and forty two between William
Johnson of the first part Joseph H Prince of the second part and William Prince of the third part a
Prince & Thomas the said William Prince has become owing to the said William H Cotton a sum to furnish to
H Barnes for the sum of two hundred dollars due on the 8th day of June 1842 and payable on the 5
first day of October 1842 and the said William H Cotton is desirous to indemnify and secure the
said William Prince against all loss and injury from the said security ship. Now this Indenture
witnesseth that the said William H Cotton for and in consideration of the promises and for the further
consideration of one dollar to him the said Joseph H Prince in hand paid at and before the
executing and delivery of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted
bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien and
confirm unto the said Joseph H Prince his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit
my slaves Peter and George one grey horse one donkey seven hogs Cattle 30 hives of bees
at his househole and kitchen furniture together with all his farming utensils of every kind and no
description also all his present growing crops of every kind now being raised on the plantation
whereon he now resides. To have and to hold the said negro slaves Peter and George together
with all the personal property herein before mentioned unto him the said Joseph H Prince his
heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Joseph H Prince his
heirs and assigns forever. In trust notwithstanding and for the use and purpose following
to wit first to permit the said William H Cotton to retain peaceable and quiet possession
of the said slaves and personal property aforesaid and to take the same and spares thereof
thereof to his own use without accounting for the same until a sale is actually made
in the manner and upon the terms herein after set forth Secondly of the said sum of two
hundred dollars shall remain unpaid on the 1st day of October 1842 when the same is due and
payable then and in that case the said Joseph H Prince his Executors or Administrators who are by
these presents fully authorized to act shall thereafter when required by the said William Prince his heirs
Executors Administrators or assigns sell and dispose of, in for example at public auction to the highest
bids for ready money having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion and given ten days
notice thereof by advertisements posted at the door of the courthouse of Blountville County and
other public places if being unable to satisfy the said slaves Peter and George and the other personal
property hereby conveyed and out of the proceeds so sold shall in the first place pay and satisfy the costs and
charges of removing and removing this deed of trust and all other expenses attending the execution of this
trust and in the second place if the proceeds are sufficient for that purpose pay and satisfy the balance o^r
sum of \$200 or such part thereof as may be then due and unpaid and ready to account for and pay
over to the said William H Cotton his heirs Executors or assigns or such person or persons as may be
entitled to the same the balance of the proceeds if any and convey the same to the purchaser on
making payment for the same. And the said William H Cotton for himself his heirs Executors
and Administrators covenants with the said Joseph H Prince his heirs Executors and Administrators
as follows to wit to warrant and defend the said slaves and other personal property aforesaid
unto the said Joseph H Prince his ^{husband} Executors and assigns against the claim or claims of
all persons whomsoever to make and prosecute or cause to be made and executed such deed or
other writings as shall be of him required for putting the premises or purchasing thereof into
actual possession of the same and confirming to such person or persons an interest aforesaid in
them and to discharge all taxes impositions and assessments made chargeable on the same
during his possession or the possession of all persons claiming under him during the continuance</sup>
