

them or their Executors and assigns or assigns of such survivor shall and will as soon after the happening of such default of payment as he or the survivor of them or their Executors and assigns or assigns of such survivor may think proper or the said Alfred & Stephenson his Executors or assigns shall request sell the said interest to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and thirty days notice thereof by advertisement to be set up at the door of the Court-house of Southampton County or some Court day previous to the day of sale: And out of the moneys arising from such sale shall after outpaying charges thereof and all other expenses pay to the said Alfred & Stephenson his Executors or assigns the said sum of One hundred and twenty dollars with the interest which may thereon lawfully have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the said Joseph Drury his heirs Executors or assigns but if the whole of the said sum of One hundred and twenty dollars shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Alfred & Stephenson his Executors administrators or assigns on or before the first day of November of the above date when the same is payable so that no demand of payment of the said sum of One hundred and twenty dollars be made then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and Virtue: For Witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written -

This Indenture made and entered into on the fifteenth day of June in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and forty two between Willis Wick of the first part and Norfol B Butler trustee of the second part and Bennett R Whitfield of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said Willis Wick stands justly indebted to the said Bennett R Whitfield by bond bearing even date with these presents in the sum of fifty two dollars and seventy three Cents and whereas the said Willis Wick is willing and desirous to indemnify make safe and secure to the said Bennett R Whitfield the forsame sum of fifty two dollars and seventy three Cents and whereas for the further assurance of the said Bennett R Whitfield, It is agreed by the said Willis Wick that a conveyance in trust trust shall be made to the said Norfol B Butler for the benefit of the said Bennett R Whitfield in case the said writing obligating should not punctually paid with interest when called for. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that Willis Wick for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him paid the receipt is hereby acknowledged by the said Willis Wick hath given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien and confirm to the said Norfol B Butler his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit - One gray mare five head of cattle six head of sheep two feather less and furnished One horse One spinning two trunks One walnut Table One pine Table two shot guns One Clock six winnow Churns One Cart and wheels Carting and plow gear two cutting axes shovel and pick fork six flax buttons chairs one plow frame To have and to hold the before named property hereby conveyed unto him the said Norfol B Butler
