heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit all the right title and interest which the
said Genl. Richardson has in and to the slaves negroes belonging to the Estate of Robert Nicholson deceased
and now held by his widow the present Mrs Nancy Brown and which interest the said Nicholson
is entitled to by his intermarriage with the late Mrs B. Nicholson also an silver watch also all
the bonds and accounts now owing and due to the said Nicholson. Upon trust nevertheless
that should the said Genl. P. Richardson fail to pay the debt herein provided for that then
the said J. R. Edwards shall when required all the property herein Conveyed after giving reasonable
notice of the same and pay over the proceeds together with the Collections made in discharge
of the debt herein provided for first of all paying the expenses incurred on the sale and
for the recording this deed and the remainder if any pay over to the said Genl. P. Richardson his

and estate which I now have or profess or may hereafter have in right of my wife fully in
and to the Estate of George Whitingfield esq^r with all the accruing emoluments and profits in any
and every way arising or occurring from the said Estate whatever also my present growing
Crop of Corn and fifteen bushels of hay to him the said Jacob Barnes. To have and to hold
the said Estate in the Estate or arising from the Estate of the above named George Whitingfield
esq^r the before named Crop of Corn and the said fifteen bushels of hay to the only proper use of
him the said Jacob Barnes his executors and assigns forever and to the said
Jonathan T. Griffin for myself my heirs and executors the said interest in the said Estate of
the said George Whitingfield esq^r Crop of Corn and the fifteen bushels of hay to the said Jacob
Barnes his executors administrators and assigns against me the said Jonathan T. Griffin
my executors administrators and assigns and against all and every person and persons what-
