heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit all the right title and interest which the
said Leml. P. Nicholson has in and to the above negroes belonging to the Estate of Robert Nicholson Jr.
and now held by his widow the present Mrs Nancy Brown and which interest the said Nicholson
is entitled to by by his intermarriage with the late John B. Nicholson also one silver watch also all
the bonds and accounts now owing and due to the said Nicholson. Upon trust nevertheless
that should the said Leml. P. Nicholson fail to pay the debt herein provided for that then
the said L R Edwards shall when required sell the property herein conveyed after giving reasonable
notice of the same and pay over the proceeds together with the collections made in discharge
of the debt herein provided for first of all paying the expenses incurred in the sale and
for the recording this deed and the remainder if any pay over to the said L P. Nicholson his

and estate which I now have or possess or may hereafter have in right of my wife Polly in
and to the Estate of George Whitfield dec'd with all the accruing emoluments and profits in any
and every way arising or accruing from the said Estate whatsoever also any present growing
Crop of Corn and fifteen head of hogs to him the said Jacob Barnes To have and to hold
the said Contract in the Estate or arising from the Estate of the above named George Whitfield
dec'd the before named Crop of Corn and the said fifteen head of hogs to the only proper use &c
 behoof of him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs assigns and assigns forever and I the said
Jonathan Striffin for myself my heirs and assigns the said interest in the said Estate of
the said George Whitfield dec'd Crop of Corn and the fifteen head of hogs to the said Jacob
Barnes his Executors administrators and assigns, against me the said Jonathan Striffin
my Executors administrators and assigns and against all and every person and persons What-
