

The aforesaid property hereby conveyed unto the said Thomas Doyle his heirs Executors
 administering and assigning against all persons whatever shall and law warrant and power agree
 by these presents upon trust nevertheless that the said Thomas Doyle his heirs Executors and
 administrators shall permit the said William Vick to remain in quiet and peaceable possession
 of the said property hereby conveyed and take the profits thereof to his own use until the sum
 be made in the payment of the said sum of three hundred dollars either in the whole or in part
 and they upon his further trust that they or any two or either of them or the survivor of
 them or the heirs Executors administrators or assigns of such survivor may think proper or
 the said John Swatney his Executors administrators or assigns shall request all the said
 property hereby conveyed or such part of the hereby granted property as the trustee or his
 representatives hereby to vest shall think sufficient for the purpose and shall think proper
 to sell first order for ready money at public auction after having given the time and place
 of sale at their own discretion and given at least ten days notice thereof by advertisement as
 up at the door of the Courthouse in the County of Southampton in some Court day previous
 to the day of sale or at some other public place or places in the County and out of the money
 arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses
 attending the aforesaid pay to the said John Swatney his Executors administrators or assigns
 the said sum of three hundred dollars with interest which may be thereon lawfully accrued
 and the balance if any shall pay to the said William Vick his heirs Executors administrators
 or assigns but if the whole of the said sum of three hundred dollars shall be fully paid off
 and discharged to the said John Swatney his heirs Executors administrators or assigns so
 that no fault of payment of the said sum of three hundred dollars be made then this
 indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue - And Witness whereof

 the third part - Witnesseth that whereas the said John W. Mosgrove is justly indebted to the said Alexander
 McLemore in two written obligations passed under the hand and seal of the said John W. Mosgrove on or about
 the 23rd day of
 March 1822 One Executed to the said Alexander McLemore for thirty two dollars and twenty five cents
 and on demand the 17th day of September 1822 also two other bonds wherein the said Alexander McLemore is
 bound as security for the said John W. Mosgrove One Executed to Robert W. Daniel also on account
 to Thomas W. Vick the amounts and times are not recited which the said John W. Mosgrove is
 willing and desirous to secure - Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration
 of the sum of One dollar lawful money of Virginia to the said John W. Mosgrove in hand paid
 by the said James McLemore trustee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents
