between William J. Horton of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and
Jesse Drury of the said County and State of the second part and Lane J. Drury of the said County
of the third part - Witness that whereas the said William J. Horton is justly indebted to the said Jesse J.
Drury in the sum of One hundred and forty five dollars and seven two Cents to be paid on the
15th day of August 1842 and in a bond bearing date with these presents more fully appearing which
the said William J. Horton is willing and desiring to redeem - Now this Indenture witnesseth
that for and in Consideration of the premises and also for the further Consideration of One dollar
to the said William J. Horton in hand paid by the said Jesse Drury at and before the making
and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that the said William J.
Horton has given granted bargained and sold released and confirmed and by these presents do
give grant bargain sell release and confirmed unto Jesse Drury his heirs and assigns forever
the following property to wit: One slave Peter and George One gray horse One black mare
seven head of Cattle 30 head of hogs all his household and kitchen furniture together with all
the farming utensils of every kind and description also all his present growing crop of every
kind now being raised on the plantation whereof he now residing with all and singular
the right and interest in and unto the said property hereby or intended to be conveyed unto the said
Jesse Drury his heirs Executors or assigns and the said William J. Horton for himself his heirs Executors
or assigns with hereby Covenant and agree to and with the said Jesse Drury his heirs Executors or
