heirs Executors or assigns and by these presents do forever defend the said property upon terms
Brevetible that the said Jesse Drury his heirs Executors or assigns shall permit the said
William Jackson to remain in quiet possession of the said property and to take the benefit
to his said use till Complaint be made of default in the said sum of One hundred and
forty five dollars and twenty two Cents either in whole or in part then and upon this
further trust that he the said Jesse Drury his heirs Executors or assigns shall and will as
soon after the happening of such Complaint of default of payment at the request of
the said J. & Drury their heirs or assigns sell the said property hereby or intended to be
conveyed or such part thereof as the said Jesse Drury his heirs Executors or assigns shall think
sufficient for that purpose to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after
giving due notice of the time and place at three different public places and out of the
Money arising from the sale thereof shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other
expenses attending the same pay to the said J. & Drury their heirs or assigns the said sum
of One hundred and forty five dollars and twenty two Cents and the interest which may thence
have lawfully accrued and the balance if any pay over to the said William Jackson his heirs
or assigns but if the whole of the said sum of \$145.22 with all legal interest and cost attending
these premises be fully discharged and no request be made in the payment of the said sum
interest and Costs then this Indenture to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

This Indenture made and entered into on this 17th day of September in the year of our Lord
Eighteen hundred and forty two between William M. Butler of the first part Nagel B. Butler the trustee of
Barrens trust the second part and William Barrens of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of
Virginia. Whereas the said William M. Butler stands justly indebted to the said William Barrens
by bond bearing even date with these presents in the sum of three hundred and twenty dollars and the 1st
day of December next which with the said William M. Butler is willing and desires to satisfy.
This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar of lawful money
of Virginia to the said William M. Butler in hand paid by the said Nagel B. Butler the trustee at and
before the sealing of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said William
M. Butler hath given granted bargained sold aliened conveyed released and confirmed and by these
presents do give grant bargain sell alien convey release and confirm to the said Nagel B. Butler his
heirs and assigns forever the following personal property to wit four feather beds and furniture
Jacks three Chat One Oak book Case and parcel books One Saps and parcel Cooking ware One
