Butler for himself his heirs Executors administrators and executors shall hereby Covenant promise and agree to and with the said Norfolk B. Butler his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever that the aforesaid property hereby Conveyed unto the said Norfolk B. Butler his heirs Executors administrators and assigns against all persons whosoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents upon trust nevertheless that the said Norfolk B. Butler his heirs Executors and executors shall permit the said William M. Butler to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said property hereby Conveyed until defunct to make in the payment of the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars either in the whole or in part and then upon this further trust that the said Norfolk B. Butler his heirs Executors administrators and assigns shall and will account after the beginning of each account of payment as he or they may think proper or the said William M. Butler his Executors administrators or assigns request all the aforesaid property hereby Conveyed or such part thereof as the said trustee or his representatives hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose and shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready Money at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and giving at least ten days previous notice of the time and place of such sale and out of the monies arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the execution of these presents pay to the said William Burden his Executors administrators or assigns the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars or so much as may then be due but if the sum of the said sum aforesaid shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said William Burden his Executors administrators and assigns so that no default of payment of the aforesaid sum be made than this Agreement to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue - And witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written -
