

default of payment as he may think proper or the said Godwin Griffin his heirs executors or assigns shall request sale the said tract of land herein named or such part thereof as shall be sufficient to satisfy the debt herein incurred with all the cost attending the same to the highest bidder paying money at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion giving ten days notice thereof at two or more public places previous to the day of sale, and out of the money arising therefrom satisfying the charges thereof and all expenses attending such sale pay to the said Godwin Griffin his heirs executors or assigns the sum of one hundred & ninety nine dollars and 75cts with the interest owing thereon and the balance if any shall pay to the said Thomas S White or his legal representatives as if the whole of the said sum of one hundred & ninety nine dollars & 75cts with the interest shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Godwin G Griffin his heirs &c on or before the 30th day of December 1842 so that no default be made in the payment of the above sum then this Indenture to be void and remain in full force and virtue, in witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year above written

This Indenture made this 19th day of January in the year of Christ 1841 between Thomas J Burton of the County of Southampton of the one part and Benjamin Story of the said County of the other part: Whereas by a decree of the County Court of Southampton in Chancery sitting directed by law to be held in the said County pronounced on the 16th day of November last in a cause then depending between William & Williams plaintiff and Saml Neal Joseph J Williams and Eliza V Williams defendants it was decreed & ordered that the said Thomas J Burton the Commissioner named in the said decree might sell at public auction on a credit of twelve months except so much ready money as would defray the expenses of the said sale of certain lands in the said decree also mentioned after advertising the time and place of sale for thirty days successively at two or more public places, taking from the purchaser these lands in equal amounts and deliver one to Wm S Williams one to Jas Viets as guardian of J Williams & the other to said Jas Viets as guardian of Eliza V Williams and that the said Thomas J Burton carry the land to sale to the purchaser or purchasers in fee, And whereas in pursuance of the said decree the said Thomas J Burton did on the 18th day of December 1840 in the premises in the County of Southampton expose to sale the lands abovesaid in the said decree that is to say one tract of land containing 150 acres more or less situated on Newway Island. And whereas at the said sale Benjamin Story became the purchaser of the said land being the highest bidder therefor at the following price to wit for the sum of three hundred & fifty one dollars and the said Benjamin Story hath requested the said Thomas J Burton to execute to the said Benjamin Story a deed for the before mentioned land so as follows: per
