Debrell shall receive directions to sell the same according to the provisions of this deed. This Indenture made this 8th day of November 1842. Between Samuel Wallace of the one part and William L Everett Sheriff of the County of Southampton of the other part. Whereas the said Samuel Wallace being now in the custody of the Sheriff by virtue of an execution sued out of the Circuit Superior Court of law & Chancery for the County of Southampton in favor of Alfred G. Bondy administrator of James Scott deceased and being about to discharge himself from custody by taking the oath of insolvency hath delivered in a Schedule of his whole Estate which among other things all his right and title in and to the tract of land wherein he now resides containing one hundred and twenty four acres be the same more or less being the tract of land purchased of James Whitbread and bound by the lands of the said James Whitbread, Harrison D Moroway etc and the said Samuel Wallace is required previous to being discharged to convey to the Sheriff the aforesaid tract of land - Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said Samuel Wallace in consideration of the premises hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William L Everett Sheriff as aforesaid the said tract of land to him the said William L Everett Sheriff as aforesaid against the claim of him the said Samuel Wallace of all and every person whatsoever - In witness whereof the said Samuel Wallace hath hereunto set his hand & seal this day and year above written
