Willis Anderson made this 18th day of July 1842 between William Davis of the first part John Vick trustee of the second part and James Vick creditor of the third part all of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said William Davis for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said John Vick etc before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged date as the further consideration of the said William Davis being justly indebted unto the said James Vick in the just and full sum of Three hundred thirty one dollars and thirty seven cents due by bond at this time also security for the said William Davis to Thomas Butler in a bond of Seven hundred thirty one dollars and thirty seven cents bearing date this day also bearing date to the said William Davis to John Davis in a bond of Sixty nine dollars and thirty cents bearing date this day also a bond due to Madison J. Davis of sixteen dollars bearing date this day of this obligation is to be binding for all bonds which the said James Vick may be bound for security for him the said William Davis, whereupon the said James Vick is paid off and released from said Securityship of said Davis which is the sole object of those presents. It hath granted bargained sold and conveyed unto the said John Vick trustee the following to wit One Negro man Albert one negro woman Judy and her increase one negro boy Jim also Negro boy George to buy here one mow mare one gray filly one yoke Oxen and eight head of cattle and then moreover to him the said John Vick to him and his heirs forever but upon this special trust and condition that the said John Vick his heirs or assigns upon being requested by the said James Vick his heirs or assigns shall make sale of the above mentioned property at publick auction for the best price that can be obtained for the same any time after advertising the same two days at the most publick places in the neighbourhood previous to the day of sale and with the money arising from the sale of said property shall first pay unto the said James Vick his heirs or assigns all his just claims and all bonds which he may be security for to the said William Davis etc which may accrue in making sales of said property the overplus if any pay to the said William Davis his heirs or assigns and the said debt warrant the right of the aforesaid property until the said John Vick his heirs and assigns for ever against any just claim or claims or any person demanding the same or any part thereof and the said John Vick for himself his heirs or assigns to agree to make sale of the said property any time when requested by the said James Vick his heirs or assigns.
