indenture, dated on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year 1842 and admitted to record in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of said County on the same day and year last aforesaid in order to secure the full payment of the sum of two hundred and eleven dollars and five cents together with all lawfully interest as coming thereon which said sum was due from the said Bennett J. Griffin to the said Winston Griffin as evidenced by a certain bond, bearing date on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October in the year 1842, executed by the said Bennett J. Griffin and payable on demand to the said Winston Griffin conveyed in trust to the said Mordough all such right, title interest and estate as he the said Bennett J. Griffin, then at the date of said last mentioned indenture or deed had, or thereafter should or might have, in right of his wife Susan Griffin (formerly one Susan Syner) in of and to one equal & undivided fourth part of a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid, whereof one Matthew Syner (who was the father of said Susan Griffin together with three other children) died lawfully seized and possessed of which said tract or parcel of land is situated on Black Creek & is bounded by the lands of William Griffin William Carbett and James Jones and also other lands belonging to and in possession of one Elmore Sumner Wilton in right of his wife one Sarah Wilton formerly Sarah Ballard; and whereas the said sum of two hundred and eleven dollars and five cents together with all interest due thereon, hath been fully paid by the said Bennett J. Griffin to the said Winston Griffin, and he the said Bennett J. Griffin in consequence thereof, has requested that the above described right, title, interest & estate as aforesaid, conveyed as aforesaid by said deed of trust to him the said Mordough be now released to him the said Bennett J. Griffin: Now therefore for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid, also, of the sum of one dollar by the said Bennett J. Griffin to him the said Mordough in hand paid at and before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipts whereof the said Mordough doth hereby acknowledge in the said Mordough with the consent of the said Winston Griffin, signified by his being a party hereto hath remised, released and forever quitted claim, and by these presents doth remise, release and fully, absolutely and forever quit claim, unto the said Bennett J. Griffin and his assigns all the estate right, title, interest, property claim and demand whatsoever, in law or equity of him the said Mordough of in and to the aforesaid right, title, interest and estate in the premises hereinbefore mentioned: and by the said deed or indenture dated on the said 11<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year 1842, conveyed in trust to him the said Mordough, he doth agree to hold the above described right title interest and estate of interest to the aforesaid one equal and undivided fourth part of the said certain tract or parcel of land hereinbefore set forth, unto him the said Bennett J. Griffin and his assigns to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Bennett J. Griffin and his assigns.
