So the said Story hath bargained & sold unto the said James M Doyal all of my property to wit: One feather bed & furniture one chest one iron fire shot gun one barrel more one and twelve head of hogs three stacks blade fodder ten barrels corn one pear cart wheel plough & cart and three ploughs two cotton two daggon ploughs & one wading hoe and chains and iron and various remainders and remainders also the estate right title interest property claim and demand whatsoever of him the said Story his heirs &c in and to the said property & tenements to have and to hold the said property with its appurtenances unto the said James M Doyal his heirs &c forever upon Trust. Nevertheless that he the said James M Doyal at the request of either of the parties shall as soon as conveniently he can after having advertised the time and place of the said day sell the said property &c for ten days at such place as he may think proper proceed to sell the same for cash and out of the monies arising therefrom first pay all reasonable charges attending the sale and then satisfy the debt above mentioned & the residue of the money arising from said to be paid to said Story or his order his heirs administrator Executor or assigns. This Indenture made and entered into this 23rd day of November A.D. 1842 between Littleton B. Edwards of the County of Southampton of the one part and William A Spark of the same County of the other part. Whereas Samuel P. Nicholson and Mary E his wife for the purpose of securing and indemnifying William A Spark, Clement Rochelle, James D. Haffenburg & John W. Gailly, his the said Samuel P. Nicholson security to a bond executed on the 19th day of April 1844 and made payable to Alfred P. Bailey administrator &c of James Scott for the sum of five thousand dollars, did by Indenture dated the 16th day of August 1841 and admitted to record in the Clerks Office of Southampton County Court on the same day give, grant, bargain, sell alien, enfeoff and confirm to the said Littleton B. Edwards his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing six hundred & thirty & 1/2 acres more or less being the same tract or parcel of land which the said Nicholson purchased of William A Spark and bounded as follows to wit: by the lands of James M Doyal the estate of Stephen Mordough the estate of James Scott and the estate of John Mordough with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land lying or in anywise appertaining &c Upon Trust. Nevertheless that when ever the securities or any one or more of them their executors or assigns should be compelled to pay the debt aforesaid for which they were security or any part thereof or whenever they should incur
