This Indenture made this eighth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two between Copeland Turner of the one part, Mordicai Bradshaw of the second part, all of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia: Whereas David Lewis on the first day of January 1841 in order to secure the payment of the sum of four hundred & twenty five dollars to Allen Edwards, did by indenture of trust of that date, convey to the said Copeland Turner his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, a certain tract, or parcel of land, this being a part of said tract or parcel of land conveyed by the said David Lewis, to the said Copeland Turner, containing Thirty one and a half acres and bounded by the lands of Benjamin Griffin Mordicai Bradshaw and others upon trust for the uses and purposes, in the said Indenture mentioned, and also as the said debt of four hundred and twenty five dollars, together with the legal interest thereon accruing, not having been fully paid off and discharged by the said David Lewis, his heirs, executors, administrators, so that default of payment was made, and the said Copeland Turner, having received notice to sell the land, contained in said deed of trust, and satisfy the debt, the said Copeland Turner after having advertised the time and place of sale by three several advertisements which were posted up at the most public places in the neighbourhood 312 days previous to the day of sale proceeded on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October 1842 and sold the said 312 acres of land being a part of the land soverained to him, to the highest bidder for ready money, when Mordicai Bradshaw became the last bidder and purchaser for the sum of \$31,500. Then this Indenture witnesseth, that for the consideration aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration of the sum of \$31,500 in hand paid, by the said Mordicai Bradshaw to the said Copeland Turner at and before the executing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) he the said Copeland Turner hath granted, bargained
