This Indenture made and entered into this 17th day of December in the year four
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two. Between Barton Taylor of the first part, William
D. Clarke of the second part, Benja E Pope, Henry Joyner, John Barham, Nathan B Bryant and
James M. Bland of the third part, all of said parties of the County of Southampton and State of Va
this Indenture witnesseth that whereas the said Barton Taylor is indebted to the above
named Benja E Pope in the sum of thirty five dollars and fifty eight cents the same appearing
by bond of even date herewith, and whereas the said Henry Joyner, John Barham, Nathan B
Bryant and James M. Bland became jointly bound some two or three years since with the said
Barton Taylor to certain Justices of the peace then sitting and forming a court, for the County of
Southampton, thereby impairing him the said Barton Taylor to dispose of a part or all of
the Estate of his father James Taylor dec^d (and whereas doubts have arisen in the minds of some of
all of said co-writers that they may eventually become sufferers on account of the said
security-ship. Now therefore in order to secure the payment of the aforesaid debt of
thirty five dollars and fifty eight cents due and owing to Benja E Pope as aforesaid, and for the
further consideration, to indemnify them the said Henry Joyner, John Barham, Nathan B Bryant
