 of Southampton and adjoining the lands of Luthbert D. Barham Mark T. Peck, Henry Steddie, George  
 Williams and Benja. E. Pope the same being the tract of land purchased by the said Barton  
 Taylor, at his father's sale, one bay Horse, one sorrell colt, one black mare, and one sorrell mare  
 one head Cattle Twenty seven head hogs, Cope corn, fodder, shucks, peas & cotton, salted Pork  
 one Still, worn & caps, one Cotton gin, thirty Cider Casks one riding saddle & bridle one shot  
 gun, one side board Two Tables twelve chairs one bed and furniture three pots one frying pan  
 one oven, one Spider, Two Carts and wheels two spinning wheels and cards and all other articles of  
 household and kitchen furniture, and farming utensils, also one negro man, named Parish,  
 also the Bonds and accts due the said Barton Taylor. To have and To hold to his proper  
 use and behoof forever Upon Trust, Nevertheless that the said Wm. D. Clarke shall by the agree-  
 ment of any one of the several parties before named after giving reasonable notice of the time & place  
 of the sale, expose to public auction the above described tract of land and other property or  
 so much thereof, as will satisfy the before mentioned debts, and out of the proceeds first pay  
 the expenses thereof, then pay the several debts aforesaid (viz) the debt due Benja. E. Pope and the  
 debt or debts in which the said Benjamin may be bound for and the balance if any pay over  
 to the said Barton Taylor or his legal Representative, and the said Barton Taylor doth  
 covenant with the said William D. Clarke, that he is possessed of an absolute fee simple  
 right in the property above conveyed, and that he will forever warrant and defend the
