 and assigns the following named property. To wit, one certain tract or parcel of land contain-
 ing two hundred and four acres, be the same more or less, lying and being in the aforesaid City
 of Southampton and adjoining the lands of Ruthbert D. Barnham, Marks & Peet, Henry Simond, George
 Williams and Benja. Poppe the same being the tract of land purchased by the said Barton
 Taylor at his father's sale, one bay Horse, one Sorrell colt, one black mare, and one somelmann
 six head cattle Twenty seven head hogs, crop corn, fodder, shucks, peas & beans, salted Pork
 one Still, worm & cap, one Cotton gin, thirty cedar Casks, one riding saddle & bridle one shot
 gun, one side board two Tables twelve chairs one bed and furniture there with one piping pipe
 one over, one Spider, two carts and wheels two spinning wheels and cards and all other articles of
 household and kitchen furniture, and farming utensils, also one negro man named Parish,
 also the Bonds and acc'ts due the said Barton Taylor. To have and to hold to his proper
 use and behoof forever Upon Trust & Everthelp that the said Wm. Clark shall by the agree-
 ment of any one of the several parties before named after giving reasonable notice of the time & place
 of the sale, expose to public auction the above described tract of land and other property or
 so much thereof, as will satisfy the before mentioned debts, and out of the proceeds first pay off
 the expenses thereof, then pay the several debts aforesaid (viz) the debt due Benj. E. Poppe and the
 debt or debts in which the said Bryant may be bound for and the balance if any pay over
 to the said Barton Taylor or his legal Representative, and the said Barton Taylor doth
 covenant with the said William D. Clark, that he is possessed of an absolute fee simple
 right in the property above conveyed, and that he will give warrant and defend the
