desirous of securing the said Prince as well the said three hundred dollars, duly bonds  
as against any and all loss he the said Prince may sustain in consequence of his being security  
as aforesaid. Now therefore this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the foregoings, and  
for the further consideration of one dollar by the said William S Godwyn paid to the said Clements,  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Richard P Clements to us given, granted  
and bargained and sold, and do by these presents give, grant, bargain or sell, set over & transfer  
unto the said William S Godwyn trustee, all of his interest in ten slaves, to wit, Jordan, Daniel,  
Lydia, Charlotte, Lucy, Henry, Albert, Harry, Francis (and Anderson); also all other interest  
in the tract or parcel of land on which his father lived, lying in the County of Southampton  
containing      acres and bounded as follows, to wit in the north by the land of S D Parker, on  
the east by the land of Levi Waller, on the south by the mill swamp of S D Parker and on the west  
by the lands belonging to the Children of Washington Clements, the said slave and land being the prop-  
erty of Sally Clements for and during her life and after her decease, then to the said Richard P Clements  
to have and to hold the said slaves and land to him the said Godwyn trustee, as aforesaid, his  
heirs and assigns. Upon trust nevertheless that he the said Godwyn shall, upon the request of  
the said Prince after being given reasonable notice of the time and place of sale sell at public auction  
on such credit as shall be agreed upon, the said interest of the said Clements in the aforesaid  
slaves and land, and out of the proceeds of said sale, pay off the aforesaid bond and interest; and  
remain the said Prince for whatever loss he may sustain as security as aforesaid having first  
satisfied the expenses of this trust; and the remainder if any, pay over to the said Clements - in  
witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals, this the day and year  
first before written.

Ichabod Johnson d<sup>r</sup> which interest the said William B Edwards inherited by marriage with Sally  
Johnson and which reversionary interest has been conveyed by the said William B Edwards to me, Lemuel  
R Gardner trustee to act as trustee of trust from the said William B Edwards for the benefit of the Narragansett  
bearing date the fifteenth day of April AD 1841 and duly recorded in the Clerks office of Southam-  
pton County which reversionary interest I Lemuel R Gardner, trustee have this day exposed to  
sale at public auction according to the terms of the aforesaid deed of trust and James H Murfey  
became the purchaser for the above amount of twenty five dollars. I Lemuel R Gardner, as trustee,  
do hereby warrant and will forever defend the aforesaid interest in the aforesaid negroes, unto the said  
James H Murfey, his heirs and assigns forever, free from all the claim or claims, demand or demands  
of all and every person whatsoever. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
affixed my seal this 25<sup>th</sup> day of April AD 1842.
