 as aforesaid. Now therefore this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the premises, and
 for the further consideration of one dollar by the said Williams & Goodwyn paid to the said Clem-
 ents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Richard P. Clements he us giving, grant-
 ed bargained and sold, and do by these presents give, grant bargain & sell, set over & transfer
 unto the said Williams & Goodwyn trustee, all of his interest in ten slaves, to wit, Jordan, Daniel,
 Lydia, Charles, July, Henry, Albert, Harry, Francis (and) Anderson; also all of his interest
 in the tract or parcel of land on which his father lived, lying in the County of Southampton
 containing _____ acres and bounded as follows, to wit on the north by the land of S^d D. Parker, on
 the east by the land of Levi Waller, on the south by the mill swamp of S^d D. Parker and on the west
 by the lands belonging to the Children of Washington Clements, the said slave and land being the prop-
 erty of Sally Clements for and during her life and after her decease, then to the said Richard P. Clements
 to have and to hold the said slaves and land to him the said Goodwyn trustee as aforesaid, his
 heirs (and) assigns Upon trust Nevertheless that he the said Goodwyn shall, upon the request of
 the said Prince after having given reasonable notice of the time (and) place of sale sell at public auc-
 tion on such credit as shall be agreed upon, the said interest of the said Clements in the aforesaid
 slaves and land, and out of the proceeds of said sale, pay off the aforesaid bond (and) interest; (and)
 reimburse the said Prince for whatever loss he may sustain as aforesaid having first
 satisfied the expenses of this trust; (and) the remainder if any, pay over to the said Clements - In
 witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals, this the day and year
 first before written.
