This Indenture made and entered into on the 23rd day of December 1842, by and between Thomas Everett of the first part, Caleb Everett of the second part, each of whom resides in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and James Barnes of the County of Hertford in the State of North Carolina of the third part last part where as the said Thomas Everett stands justly indebted to the said James Barnes in the sum of eight hundred sixty three dollars & Seventy two cents by bond of even date bearing the same payable and demand the payment of which together with the legal interest accruing thereon the said Thomas Everett are willing & desirous effectually to secure and agree to the said James Barnes now therefore this indenture witnesseth that the said Thomas Everett as will in consideration of the premises as of the further sum of one dollar current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Caleb Everett at and before the concluding and delivery of these presents the full receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and from every part of which the said Caleb Everett and all his legal representatives are forever released exonerated and discharged by the said Thomas Everett were bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant & bargain and sell unto the said Caleb Everett his heirs and assigns the following named property. To wit the tract of land whereon the said Thomas Everett now lives supposed to contain one hundred and forty two acres one other tract or parcel of land lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton supposed to contain about two hundred acres bounded by the land of the following named persons to wit Alexander Myrick, Davis Bryant, Barnell Everett, Walter Myrick & Thomas Benson, one old negro woman named Phillis, one old negro man named Tom, one son and house, one bay mare, one bay colt twenty head of cattle, fifty head of hogs - five head of sheep, fifteen head of geese, about twenty five barrels of corn a parcel of fodder, two pair carthulles, two plow horses five weid horses, two acres grain, two wedges, one grind stone, one Cotton gin & its appurtenances, five featherbeds & furniture, two Tables of walnut & pine, two painted chests, one blue, the other black, one walnut desk two trunks, two pots, two dutch ovens, one pan, one Skillet, twelve plates, several porcelains and some chargin. To have and to hold the before described tract of land, also such and all the before named articles of personal property and every part and parcel thereof, with all the right title interest and estate to both the before named bonds & other articles of property to him the said Caleb Everett his heirs and assigns forever, in trust nevertheless that if the said Thomas Everett his Executor, administrator or any other person for him and at his request at any time hereafter, shall will and truly pay to the said James Barnes his Executor or assignee the before named sum of eight hundred sixty three dollars and Seventy two cents together with the legal interest which shall accrue thereon as well as the costs of recording this indenture that then this indenture and every thing therein contained shall be void and of none effect, but if the said Thomas Everett nor any other person as aforesaid shall nor doth not pay the aforesaid debt interest and costs as aforesaid or such part thereof as shall or may at such time be due and owing, that then and in such event of failure to pay as aforesaid to the said James Barnes his Executor administrator or assignee he the said Caleb Everett shall and may sell so much or all of the before named property at auction for cash as will raise a sufficient sum of money to discharge the said sum of eight hundred sixty three dollars and Seventy two cents with the interest which shall have accrued & costs as aforesaid or as much thereof as shall at such time be due
