

Rice B Pierce for fifteen hundred and fifty five dollars and 84/100 due 31st of December 1842. one due Jesse Santford for five hundred and eighty eight dollars and 13/100 due July 1842. one bond due Thomas Butler for eleven hundred and eighty seven dollars and 90/100 due July 4th 1842. one bond due James Williams for one hundred & sixty dollars due January 31st 1842. one bond due Joseph Diner one hundred and twenty nine dollars due June 31st 1841 one due Samuel Williams of NC for nine hundred dollars due 30th of January 1841, one bond due John Harris for one hundred dollars due 30th January 1841. one bond due Alfred Ricks for five hundred and eighty eight dollars & 55/100 due January 2^d 1843. And the same obligation to binding for all bonds or accounts which may be justly due the said James Vick at the time of making sale of the said land and negroes I convey unto the said Jesse B Vick the following land and negros to wit one tract of land called the Vickville containing three hundred and sixty acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows To wit by the lands of John Vick, J^r H Davis, Jesse B Vick, Robert Ricks Samuel Ricks and Mary F Vick one tract of land my home plantation One thousand three hundred and thirty five bounded by the lands of William Davis, Arrington Vick, Joseph Gardner, Peter River and Mary F Vick. Vickville. John H Davis and Nason Drake be the same more or less I convey unto the said Jesse B Vick the following Negroes, Ned. Baby Sam also all my interest in the Estate of Nancy James which I purchased of Gethard Drake. I convey unto the said Jesse B Vick all right title claim or demand or any part thereof in the above land and negroes, but upon this special trust and condition that the said Jesse B Vick his heirs or assigns shall make sale of the above mentioned land & negroes at publick sale for the best price that can be obtained for the same any time after the 2^d day of January 1843, after advertising ten days notice to the day of sale at the Court house door and at as many other places as the said Jesse B Vick may see fit with the money arising from the sales of the said land and Negroes shall first pay unto the said James Vick all his just claims and all the bonds that the said James Vick may be standing security for the said John Vick then pay unto the said John Vick the over plus of any and the said John Vick do warrant the receipt of the above said land & negroes unto the said Jesse B Vick his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Vick do warrant and forever defend against any person claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof.
